### RESEARCH SPOTLIGHT

UC San Diego researchers, led by Dr. Gail Heyman (Psychology) and Dr. Sarah Creel (Cognitive Science) have demonstrated that native speakers of Mandarin Chinese are more musical, at an earlier age, than their English-speaking counterparts. This appears to be due to the fact that Mandarin is a tonal language, which conveys very different meanings for the same syllable said with differing pitch emphasis.

Dr. Diana Deutsch, also of the Psychology Department, first theorized that tonal language experience leads to enhanced pitch perception. This new study builds on that theory and appears to demonstrate an interconnectedness of cognitive mechanisms not previously thought to exist between seemingly different abilities. Since native Mandarin speakers must be sensitive to the pitch of a word in order to understand its meaning, they have more experience at an earlier age with pitch processing than those whose language is not as dependent upon pitch. This translates to an easier time understanding musical pitch, and more musical ability in general.
