RESEARCH SPOTLIGHT

Lying to Kids Leads to Lying Kids

New research by Dr. Leslie Carver and former honors student Chelsea Hays suggests that if children are told untrue statements, they are more likely to lie in the immediate future.

In the experiment, children aged 3-6 were told by an experimenter that there was a huge bowl of candy in the next room; the experimenter quickly confessed that the candy bowl was a lie to get kids to play a game. Other children were given no mention of candy.

Once the game started, children were played clips of popular character toys making noises; they were asked to identify which toy made which noise (for example, Cookie Monster said "I love cookies"). Then researchers played Beethoven's "Fur Elise," not associated with any particular character, and left the room, supposedly to make a phone call.

Children were told not to peek at the "toy" playing the song while the researcher was out of the room. Once the researcher returned, children were asked whether they peeked. More than 90% of the older lied-to children lied about peeking, compared to 60% of children who were not lied to, suggesting that lies have a profound effect on subsequent truth-telling behavior.
