We hope you'll also join us in August or September for an orientation session; if you attend one of our Transfer Orientations, you can also sit down for a one-on-one appointment with an advisor.

- Enroll in appropriate classes during your enrollment time.
- Plan to stay proactive during Fall quarter (go to Advising Hours and Office Hours, and make use of campus resources).
- Show up prepared and ready to learn.
- Locate opportunities, take risks, and find your community on campus.

Once you've sent your final transcripts to the university, your transfer history will post on TritonLink within a few weeks. After this happens, you should review it for accuracy; we'll be happy to answer any specific questions regarding enrollment, classes, and your remaining Lower Division requirements at that time.

ORIENTATION AND ONE-ON-ONE ADVISING

All incoming transfer students are encouraged to take advantage of our proactive advising and Orientations.

NEW STUDENT SITE

You will receive personalized enrollment recommendations in July or August through the portal on the New Student Site. Throughout the summer you can send us questions there 24 hours a day (we'll get you answers within 2-3 business days). If you do not receive your recommendations by August 17th, please contact us via the portal.

PSYCHOLOGY TRANSFER ORIENTATION AND ONE-ON-ONE ADVISING

We recommend that you register for one of the Psychology Orientation sessions specifically marked for Transfer Students; these include both an introduction to the department and our majors, and a 15-20 minute one-on-one session with an advisor to plan your Fall quarter classes and create an academic plan. Sessions are held in August and September on campus; we are not able to accommodate telephone or Skype appointments at this time. PSYCHOLOGY DEPARTMENT ORIENTATION

Students unable to attend a Transfer Orientation session may choose to register for one of our more general Department Orientations, offered during Welcome Week. Department Orientations do not include one-on-one advising. Any of our Orientation sessions will cover the information you need to know about your chosen major within the Psychology Department, including major requirements, course equivalency, the schedule of classes, prerequisites, waitlists, and more.

Please note that the Psychology Orientation Sessions are completely separate from any orientation your college may offer, so plan to attend both.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- * What Psychology majors are available to me, and what are the requirements?
- * How do I choose the best major for me?

- * Can I take any classes Pass/No Pass?
- * Can I apply to the Honors Program if I'm a new transfer student?
- * I transferred from another four-year institution. Why does my Degree Audit still say that I need to take all of my Psychology major courses? I know I completed some!

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SUMMER COURSE OFFERINGS

Taking summer classes demonstrates your academic motivation to future employers and graduate schools and provides you with more flexibility during the academic year to pursue other research and internship opportunities. The following courses are highly recommended for new transfer students who wish to begin their studies this summer.

SUMMER SESSION 1

PSYC 100 - Clinical Psychology - Tu/Th 11:00am-1:50pm (Psychology Core)

This course provides a comprehensive overview of the causes, characteristics, and treatment of psychological disorders. Particular emphasis is given to the interaction between biological, psychological, and sociocultural processes contributing to abnormal behavior.

PSYC 101 - Developmental Psychology - M/Tu/W/Th 12:30pm-1:50pm (Psychology Core)

This course provides a comprehensive overview of the field of developmental psychology, including topics in cognitive, language, and social development.

PSYC 104 - Social Psychology - M/W 5:00pm-7:50pm (Psychology Core)

This course provides a comprehensive overview of the field of social psychology, covering a review of the field's founding principles, classic findings, and a survey of recent findings. Topics will include social perception, attributions and attitudes, stereotypes, social influence, group dynamics, and aggressive and prosocial tendencies.

PSYC 106 - Behavioral Neuroscience - M/Tu/W/Th 9:30am-10:50am (Psychology Core)

This course provides a comprehensive overview of human and animal behavior from a neuroscience perspective. Topics include the functions and mechanisms of perception, motivation (sex, sleep, hunger, emotions), learning and memory, and motor control & movement.

PSYC 190 - Parenting - M/W 5:00pm-7:50pm (Psychology Elective/Specialization)

This course provides an interdisciplinary overview of theories and scientific research on parenting. Topics may include family structure, parenting styles, attachment, discipline strategies, culture, and media.

SUMMER SESSION 2

PSYC 70 - Research Methods - M/Tu/W/Th 9:30am-10:50am & Tu or W 3:00pm-4:50pm (Formal Skills)

This course provides an overview of how to choose appropriate research methods for experimental and non-experimental studies. Topics may include classic experimental design and counterbalancing, statistical power, and causal inference in experimental and non-experimental and non-experimental settings.

PSYC 102 - Sensory Neuroscience - Tu/Th 8:00am-10:50am (Psychology Core)

This course provides a comprehensive overview of the neural mechanisms that support vision, audition, touch, olfaction, and taste.

PSYC 105 - Cognitive Psychology - Tu/Th 11:00am-1:50pm (Psychology Core)

This course provides a comprehensive overview of cognitive psychology, the scientific study of mental processes: How people acquire, store, transform, use, and communicate information. Topics may include perception, attention, language, memory, reasoning, problem solving, decision making, and creativity.

PSYC 180 - Adolescence - Tu/Th 5:00pm-7:50pm (Psychology Elective/Specialization)

This course provides an overview of the period of human adolescence, including the physical, cognitive, social, and emotional changes that take place during this developmental transition.
